State Stream

The State Stream is designed for athletes to compete in competitions up to the State Titles in a program with modified figures and routine time limits. State Stream swimmers cannot be members of National Stream duets, teams, or combos. State Stream routines may place a bid prior to the State Titles to ASWA to pre-swim at the Australian National Championships.

State stream routines will use the old scoring system. No coach cards are required to be submitted for these routines. There are no required elements for state stream routines.

Please refer to the World Aquatics Rules (Appendix III) for the set number of elements for national stream routines.

All routines are +/- 5 seconds.

Deck work must be 10 seconds or less.

In all routine events, the walk-on of the competitors from the designated starting point to the achievement of a stationary position(s) may not exceed 30 seconds for Technical or Free Mixed Duets, Technical and Free Teams, for Free Combination and Acrobatic Routine and may not exceed 20 seconds for any Solo and Duet events.

Age Groups/Categories

All Age Group competitors remain qualified from 1 January to the following 31 December at the age they are at the close of day (23:59) on 31 December of the year of the competition.

Masters

Masters competitors and coaches must follow the World Aquatics Rules located in the Competition Regulations Document (Updated 1st January 2024). Judging of Masters routines will be executed using the old scoring system. Therefore, no coach cards are required to be submitted for these routines.

Star Skills Program

The Star Skills program is an ASWA initiative that has been running in the recreational program. This program has been expanded and will replace the national stream 'skills testing' from previous seasons. Our aim was to create a clear progression of skills to develop our athletes and coaches and improve our performance in WA. The Star Skills program is like a thread linking all levels in our sport together, from recreational to high performance.

For stars 9-16, ASWA will organise times with club coaches to attend their training sessions and assess the swimmers. Dates for national stream, star skills assessments this season have been included in the season calendar. Although we have provided recommendations for the star levels for each age group, coaches will decide on the star levels that their swimmers will be assessed on based on their abilities.

Please note: If swimmers in more advanced groups wish to start at star one (recreational level), their club coaches can assess them at any time throughout the season.

ASWA coaches along with the swimmer's club coach will assess the passing requirements for each skill. An ASWA judge will also give an overall score for each skill.

There is a clear set of passing requirements for each star skill which is detailed in the star program manual. Swimmers will receive a certificate and a star pin for each level they pass.

World Aquatics and ASWA Rules and Resources

Unless otherwise stated in the information above, ASWA follows World Aquatics rules for all competitions. Coaches must acknowledge their responsibility to stay up to date with rule changes. Failing to do so puts the athletes at a significant disadvantage during competitions as penalties and deductions could apply.

There is a variety of educational resources including learning modules available on the World Aquatics Website which can be used to learn more about the rule changes. Please see page 8 of this document for a list of the World Aquatics rules and resources. Resources for coaches include detailed tutorials on coach cards and declared difficulty.

In addition to the free resources provided by World Aquatics, all ASWA coaches have access to a Microsoft Teams database with shared resources. ASWA coaching staff are also available to contact at anytime throughout the season.
